

IMPORTANT TASKS FOR RAISING THE MORALE OF YOUNG PEOPLE AND MEANINGFUL ORGANIZATION OF THEIR FREE TIME WERE DETERMINED

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Abstract

30% of the population of our country are young people between 14 and 30 years old. Modern conditions and opportunities have been created for their education and occupation. At the same time, organization of meaningful free time of young people is an urgent issue. The more spiritually perfect young people are, the stronger their immunity against various foreign diseases will be.

It is known that the head of our state put forward 5 important initiatives to start work in the social, spiritual and educational spheres on the basis of a new system.

The first initiative serves to increase the interest of young people in music, painting, literature, theater and other types of art, and to reveal their talent.

The second initiative is aimed at physical training of young people and creation of necessary conditions for them to show their abilities in the field of sports.

The third initiative is aimed at organizing the effective use of computer technologies and the Internet among the population and young people.

The fourth initiative is aimed at organizing systematic work on raising the spirituality of young people and widely promoting reading among them.

The fifth initiative provides for women's employment issues.

This noble idea started during the visit of our President to the Syrdarya region, and in a short period of time, great things were done. 300,000 copies of fiction literature were delivered to the libraries of districts and cities in this area. Music and art schools were provided with musical instruments, sports facilities were provided with equipment. These works were continued in Namangan region, and the "Caravan of Enlightenment" was established. 25,000 books, 80 types of sports equipment and musical instruments were delivered to the youth. These 5 initiatives were met with great interest by our people, especially by our youth. At the meeting, the issues of wide implementation of this experience in all regions of Uzbekistan were discussed.

Today, it was noted that only 130,000 boys and girls are enrolled in more than 800 cultural centers, 312 music and art schools in our country, and most of these institutions are not adequately provided with educational manuals, sheet music, musical instruments and equipment. The head of our state studied the material and



technical base of local cultural centers, music and art schools and their use, and gave orders to improve their activities.

The Ministry of Culture and the Ministry of Public Education, together with the governors, were tasked with organizing an additional 1,500 clubs based on the interest of young people in district (city) cultural centers and general education schools. It was emphasized the need to organize artistic and amateur groups, youth theater-studios and "Youth clubs" in cultural centers, involving enterprising and talented young people and local sponsors.

Taking into account the good results of attaching famous artists and talented artists as assistants to cultural activities in the districts, instructions were given to spread this experience throughout the country. According to it, well-known artists are attached to districts and cities as creative consultants and are responsible for the development of culture and art in those places, and district and city mayors provide financial and organizational support to these works. Attention was also paid to the issue of increasing the number of highly educated personnel in the field of music and art.

The Ministries of Higher and Secondary Special Education and Public Education have been tasked to organize traveling history lessons on specific topics in museums, historical monuments, monuments and theaters. While discussing the issues related to the second initiative, it was noted that there are more than 12,000 sports facilities in our country, but the level of inclusion of young people in physical education and mass sports is insufficient. While the rate of equipping of general education schools with sports equipment is 56% in the country, only 12% in Surkhandarya region, 14% in Khorezm and 15% in Karakalpakstan. At the meeting, measures were determined to involve young people in physical education and sports. Deputy mayors of districts and cities on youth issues were tasked with studying the interest of young people in sports and the level of equipment of sports facilities together with experts, making proposals based on this, and determining the source of funds necessary for their implementation to the Cabinet of Ministers. It was emphasized the need to build small gyms and artificial turf fields from lightweight sandwich panels in remote and remote villages, and to allocate land to enterprising entrepreneurs for the construction of sports facilities. Such entrepreneurs are allocated preferential loans by Milliybank as part of the State program "Youth is our future". It was noted that appointing wellknown international competition winners to local sports schools as leaders, as well as purposeful training of athletes in special extramural departments of higher educational institutions, will bring good results. Tasks were given to increase the number of sports schools for children and teenagers.



At the Videoselector meeting, special attention was paid to the issues of protecting young people from harmful attacks on the Internet and teaching them to use information technologies efficiently. The Ministry of Information Technologies and Communications Development was tasked with establishing Digital Technology Training Centers in all cities and district centers based on international best practices. In these centers, e-commerce and programming are taught free of charge, innovative business skills are formed in the field of information technologies, and "startup" projects are supported. Today, despite the fact that all schools have computer equipment, the internet service is not being used sufficiently. The Ministry of Public Education, the Ministry of Information Technologies and Communications Development was tasked with developing a plan of measures to provide computer classes in all schools with modern technologies and high-speed Internet until 2021. With the involvement of enterprising entrepreneurs, it was emphasized the need to establish computer game centers, to have tests, quizzes, development strategies and other useful programs that serve to expand the knowledge and outlook of children and young people. Instilling a love of books in young people from childhood, forming an independent mind and a broad worldview will be a solid foundation for their life paths. However, many villages and neighborhoods do not have the necessary conditions for this. The Information Resource Centers, which were established in place of the previous libraries, could not fulfill the tasks assigned to them. Taking into account these circumstances, it is planned to deliver additional books to places based on the number of young people within the framework of the new initiative.

The head of our state instructed the official ministries and agencies to publish books on artistic, educational and social topics within the framework of the "Caravan of Enlightenment" project and to deliver no less than 1 million copies to the Republic of Karakalpakstan and all regions. At the meeting, it was noted that local governments should establish one model bookstore in each city and district center. The Information and Mass Communications Agency was tasked with providing library services to the residents of villages and villages by setting up mobile book pavilions in all cities and districts and launching "Bibliobuses".

Issues of employment of women were also discussed at the meeting. For this purpose, in 2019-2020, it is planned to establish 195 sewing and knitting enterprises from sandwich panels in all districts. Places with dense population and many labor resources were chosen for their construction. As a result of the establishment of these enterprises, it is planned to create more than 24 thousand permanent jobs for women. Taking into account that there are more women willing to work than the number of jobs, the President emphasized the need to organize work in 2 shifts and produce



consumer products in them. In order to widely implement the 5 initiatives mentioned at the meeting, official leaders were assigned to all regions. Also, the chairman of the Dzhokorgi Council of the Republic of Karakalpakstan, governors of regions, Tashkent city, districts and cities, "Nuroniy", "Mahalla" funds, Women's Committee, Youth Union leaders were personally responsible and accountable for these tasks. Information on the discussed issues was heard.

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
